This will require the museum to be open seven days a week and will need to put signs up along the highway to bring people in. This should generate 50 k people visiting the museum each year.

The Wolfman Jack studio looking for a new home was offered to the museum. The museum excitedly accepted and are waiting for the studio to be dismantled and moved to the museum.































Meeting Minutes

It was a good way to kill some time on a cool and breezy Sunday Morning





This yearly club outing ended a few years ago when the weight of several T-Birds broke Gil's septic/sewer system and a major plumbing bill followed. Jennifer and several helpers have brought back Tech Day, (Gil's Garage) to American River College in Sacramento, with Ross Woodman heading up the tech session. In 2019 Marlon H., Jim M., Bill Graham and I attended "Tech Day" and it was very helpful to me as a CTCI regional convention was upcoming in Flagstaff, AZ; Terry H. and I attended where I judged special items.

Earl Pillow and I took off in my Retro 2002 "New Yeller" with my AAA Sacramento maps and after over taking the correct exit we found American River College - but then we got lost again on campus - we were on a nature trail (gravel road) before we got turned around and found the shop building. Jennifer and Ross W. greeted us warmly and we signed in. The shop is huge with 11 bays and several classrooms. (A new shop that is state of the art is being built to replace this building - should be even better.) We had coffee and donuts and watched as more beautiful T-Birds arrived. It was a small turnout according to Ross. One Red '55, a Peacock Blue '56 and four '57 lil birds - a '61 two door hardtop and a '63 convertible roadster; also, a 1956 Caddy Biarritz and Sunbeam Tiger with my Retro and a few brand X's. Class was called to order by Ross about 10:00 am subject intake manifolds, paint and the crossover tubes that run thru the '56 and '57 intakes and connect to the auto chokes ('55 does not have this feature as the choke is located down on the intake manifold itself). We also touched on heater control valve - Ross gave us some paperwork and let class inspect six T-Birds on lifts and hoods up - I was in T-Bird heaven. All the T-Birds were "in the air" except the '55 and my Retro. Many tips and ideas made class a joy and it was good to see old friends from my Sacramento days. Mountain Mike's sent four giant pizzas and we ended class with lunch and more T-Bird stories. Earl P. and I had a great time and I'm looking forward to the Thunderbird Extravaganza with these guys.
