





Keith and Elaine's car is now sporting white walls, for the first time since the family has owned it



These ventures would not have been possible without the invaluable contributions of Darlene.

Darlene's gifts were not just limited to design. She also possessed a remarkable culinary prowess. Upon entering her meticulously curated home, her loved ones were often greeted with the inviting aromas of freshly baked bread, delectable holiday cookies, and soul nourishing home-cooked meals. Her cooking was an expression of love.

In 1982, Darlene cultivated her culinary talent and embarked on a new venture: owning and operating the family-owned restaurant known as the Opera House. While the restaurant may not have been a great financial triumph, it became a place where loved ones could come together, share meals, and celebrate special occasions.

While the City of Tracy held a special place in Darlene's heart, it was her family who held the key to her soul. She found immense joy in the presence of her children, Dale and Greg Cose. Her grandchildren Chris, Haley, Drew, Jake and Sophia. Her great-grandchildren, and extended family members, including her beloved nieces. # QC - MONTEREY FRIDAY'S DRIVE





### THE REDMAN-HIRAHARA HOUSE A GRAND OLD CALIFORNIA HOME

The Redman-Hirahara House in the Pajaro Valley, south of Watsonville, California was constructed in 1897. The house is located on a 1.8-acre parcel of land. The Queen Anne Victorian style home was designed by architect William Weeks for beet farmer James Redman. Weeks was a well-known architect, known for designing the Casino Arcade at the Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk, among hundreds of other buildings across California. The Redman-Hirahara house is the only surviving rural farmhouse designed by Weeks. It's obvious that the home's name comes from having been owned by James Redman, but where does the name Hirahara come into the picture?
