TBird Rescue 101



This all started with a phone call; Keith Rogers was contacted by a lady, Lou from Walnut Creek. The city wanted her to remove a non-running 1960 T-bird from her driveway – I guess the neighbors turned Lou in. Without any luck Lou tried to donate this T-bird to a school or club so it wouldn't be towed away and junked. Keith contacted Jim M. who enlisted the help of Tom Tomlin and Ruben T - a trip was made to Walnut Creek. The car had been parked since 2018 and needed much work. Also, in Lou's driveway was a 1959 Edsel Ranger 2DRHT (two door hard top). Jim M. called Paul Lubker who called the only Edsel nut in our club ... ME.

The rescue was on. Lou was contacted by Jim M. who will fix up the 60 T-bird – I contacted my friend Mike – who bought my Edsel and Mike brought his friend Mark (from Crown Powder Coating) – we set off from Turlock with two car trailers and 8 wheels and tires not knowing what to expect. Lou had tried to sell the two cars, and someone had returned and stole most of the wheels by midnight auto supply!

Lou's home is on a cul-de-sac and our car trailers took up the whole block. I met Lou – a women in her mid-80's and a car girl – she used two canes to come out and watch the cars being loaded. I had brought some pictures of my 58 Edsel, and we talked about Lou's trips to Reno's Hot August Nights in the T-bird, and I think both of us went back in time to our younger days. Lou spoke of bringing her parents from Texas out west when the T-bird was new. I know it was hard for Lou to part with her babies (cars) as some of the neighbors watched Mike and Mark struggle to load the cars.

The 60 T-bird put up a good fight as the rear brake drum was frozen and I don't think it wanted to leave Walnut Creek. After much pounding with Ford tools (hammers), the stubborn drum finally came off and the T-bird was on four wheels again. Mark got his loooong car trailer backed into Lou's cul-de-sac and the T-bird




was loaded up at last - it really gave us a fight. Next, the Edsel was loaded on Mike's car trailer. Lou brought out some old pictures of the T-bird, Edsel Convertible and a 54 Buick Rag Top - Lou had some nice cars, and she did much of the repairs and maintenance herself, a great lady.



All the paperwork was done, and pictures were taken of Lou, Mark, Mike and I in front of Mike's car trailer and we waved goodbye to Lou and her friend Lisa; and made a dash for the Altamont pass hoping to miss the commute. We got lots of thumbs up and a comment, two for the price of one. It was a beautiful sight to see these cars headed for new homes - knowing they will be back on the road again and looking and running and enjoyed - as they were in Lou's care - they will be like new again.





Every spring in March we bring our little 'Bird out of winter hibernation. We feed it a healthy diet of water, gas, oil and air, and sometimes new spark plugs. We are ready for our annual flight to Yosemite National Park.

The flight is about two hours depending on how many landings are made for photo ops. Our roost for the night is the Tanya Lodge just outside the park. Early the next morning we continue into the park via the Hwy 41 entrance from Fresno. From this vantage point there is a spectacular view of the whole valley, including El Capitan, Bridal Veil Falls, and the awesome Half Dome.

Once in the valley floor, we spend the day exploring the wildlife, and the beautiful Dogwood trees in full bloom. The main attraction is the breathtaking waterfalls, which are extremely full after a very heavy winter snowfall and late heavy spring rains.

The year 2005 that we took these pictures as there were many cars passing by and you are not allowed off road parking.

When we left the park late in the afternoon on our return flight home, floodwater was up to the shoulder of the road, all though the weather was clear and sunny. The runoff from snow melting above was beginning to flood the valley floor. The roads were closed shortly after we left the park. Some tourists and campers were stranded in the park for three days. We couldn't think of a better place to be stranded, but not in the T-Bird, as there is not much freeboard. We made a safe landing back home. We still look forward to our flights into the park at least once a year.

We purchased our T-Bird in 1972 to use as a driver. Originally, it was ordered from a local Ford dealer, and we are the third owners. It is an early 1956 Fiesta Red. When we purchased it, the upholstery was in good shape as was the body. We painted it Bronze shortly after we bought it. In 2005 we replaced the engine with a 312 Ford rebuilt one. We added disc brakes and air conditioning, but the upholstery is still original. We hope to be able to remedy that along with new paint sometime this coming year.

Until then, we will continue to enjoy our outings with the Modesto Area Thunderbird Club. Two of our children and their spouses have joined the club this year so we will be having some more fun times six.

Christmas Party and Installation of Officers to be held on Sunday December 3, 11:30 at the H-B Saloon in Oakdale


